MARIE SKŁODOWSKA-CURIE ACTIONS

Recently Marie (Skłodowska)-Curie Actions (MSCA) have celebrated the 20th anniversary. Since 1996, M(S)CA have provided grants to train researchers at all stages of their careers – be they doctoral candidates or experienced researchers – while encouraging transnational, inter-sectoral and interdisciplinary mobility. MSCA are considered as the most international programme among H2020. The programme is named after the double Nobel Prize winner Marie Skłodowska-Curie to honour and spread the values she stood for. To date, almost 100,000 researchers have benefited from the programme – among them five Nobel laureates and an Oscar winner. Only during FP7 MSCA fellows produced more than 25 000 publications.

The aim of the national information day, which is organised at the premises of the Czech Academy of Sciences, is to present the programme as well as its achievements and impact. Successful MSCA applicants will present their research. Last but not least, practical advice how to submit and write a proposal will be given.
